- (i) The Portsmouth City Council standard funding levels for nursing care placements, also referred to as the 'social care rate', is net of the NHS funding. This means that homes will receive the rates quoted above from Portsmouth City Council plus the appropriate level of Funded Nursing Care.
- (ii) Existing arrangements which have been individually negotiated over the 2015/16 PCC standard funding level will be subject to a 0% increase for 2016/17
- (iii) In the case of Continuing Healthcare Placements the negotiated price of a Unit of Health is inclusive of Funded Nursing Care
- (iv) In the case of clients placed by Health on a 'Spot Purchase', also referred to as a 'Temporary Placement' whose Continuing Healthcare eligibility has not been determined, the price of a Unit of Service shall be as that for the appropriate fee Category of Client Care as set out in the Social Care Schedule of Fees plus the appropriate level of Funded Nursing Care.
- (v) If following assessment the clients are deemed eligible for Continuing Healthcare Funding then the Service Provider shall deliver the Service Purchaser an additional written invoice for the deficit between the combined Social Care and Funded Nursing Care fee and the final negotiated Unit of Health for the period of the 'Spot Purchase'/ 'Temporary Placement'.
